UPCOMING FOOTPATH CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM

Council's Civil Operations team are scheduled to commence work on constructing footpaths in the following areas in accordance with Council's 10-year Footpath Program Strategy and annual budget program:

- ➔ **February/March** — Brockworth Road from Normandy Place to Penshurst Road
- ➔ **March/April** — McFarlane Avenue from Tennyson Terrace to Clyde Street
- ➔ **April/May** — Prospect Road from McFarlane Avenue to Flinders Highway.

Signage will be installed prior to works commencing to warn of the upcoming works and will remain in place during the construction phase.

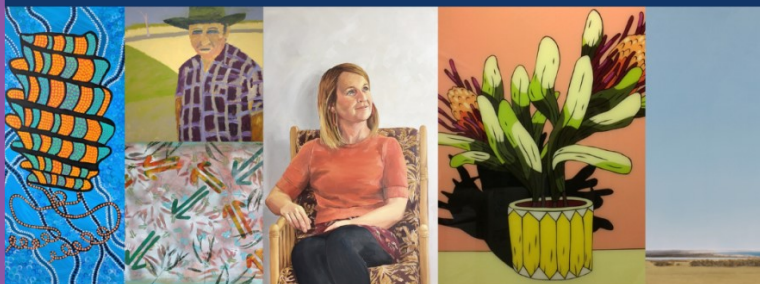
