Council is calling for applications for funding under the Community Grant Funding Program for the upcoming 2019/2020 financial year. The community grant funding is available to support eligible local events, projects, programs and activities that contribute to Council's Strategic Plan objectives.

Applicants are invited to apply for funding under the following categories, with the funds to be distributed from July 2019:

- 📌 **Group** - Funding up to \$300
- 📌 **Local** - Funding up to \$1,000
- 📌 **Regional** - Funding of \$1,001-\$2,000 (including any Council in-kind support)
- 📌 **Major** - Funding of \$2,001 and above on a case by case basis (including any Council in-kind support)

To apply, applicants must complete the appropriate form relevant to their funding category available on Council's website at www.portlincoln.sa.gov.au/grantfunding or a hardcopy can be obtained from the Council Administration Office during normal business hours.

A small amount of funding will be available all year round for applications under the group and local categories. However, we strongly encourage applicants to apply now under this funding call.

SPEED LIMITS ON COUNCIL ROADS



Did you know that the speed limit on Council residential roads (built up areas) is 50 km per hour unless otherwise sign posted.



When driving through school zones there is a speed limit of 25km per hour when a child is present, including outside of school hours. Speed limits also apply in certain circumstances, such as a 25km per hour applies while passing a school bus that has stopped to pick up or drop off children, or when passing a stationary emergency services vehicle that has its blue and/or red lights flashing.

Drivers are also required to give a minimum of one metre when passing a cyclist where the speed limit is 60km per hour or less or 1.5 metres where the speed limit is over 60km per hour.
