COUNCIL BY-LAWS COME INTO OPERATION ON 6 NOVEMBER 2018

The City of Port Lincoln completed a review of its suite of By-laws in June this year with the adoption of five Council By-laws to come into operation from Tuesday 6 November 2018, four months after the day on which the By-laws were published in the Government Gazette, as required by section 249(5) of the Local Government Act 1999.

The By-laws were referred to the Legislative Review Committee of Parliament for scrutiny pursuant to the Subordinate Legislation Act 1978. The Legislative Review Committee raised no concerns in regard to the endorsed By-laws and therefore the By-laws will stand as adopted for the next seven years.

The new Council By-laws are based on Council's existing By-laws with no significant changes made other than to address legislative changes that have occurred since the By-laws were last adopted in 2011 and to reference relevant Council policies where relevant. The five By-laws are:

Mayor Bruce Green said, "By-Laws are made to allow Council to provide good governance over the City of Port Lincoln for the convenience, comfort, fairness and safety of the community. The By-Laws allow Council to manage activities on roads, footpaths, Local Government land and public places, as well as the management and control of dogs in the city".

The next review of the By-laws will be undertaken in 2025.
